



SAMPLE FOUR-YEAR PLAN FOR ELEMENTARY EDUCATION, EARLY CHILDHOOD SPECIAL EDUCATION

Updated: April 2011

Note: Admission to Teacher Education is usually gained after students have successfully completed EDU 200, EDU 205 and PSY 121. A GPA of 2.75, Virtus training, and successful completion of the CAAP (basic skills) test is required for admission. LIB 105, 110, 220, PSY 121, MAT 110, MAT 111, and the advanced general education categories AA, AC and AH must be completed with a grade of C or better. A GPA of 2.75 and the completion of all major coursework with a grade of C or better are required for admission to Student Teaching.

Elementary Education requires an area of specialization. Coursework for most specializations (e.g., Language Arts, Mathematics, Reading, Social Studies, Spanish) can begin in the first and sophomore years.

JANUARY TERM

<p>Students admitted Fall 2007 or later are required to complete a minimum of two January terms. Transfer students who transfer in 40 credits or more are required to complete at least one January term. Education students who plan to student teach in the spring semester will not be able to complete a January term course prior to the spring student teaching term. Please plan to complete the two required January term courses within the first three years.</p>	CR
